A plea for common sense within the USGA

or decades, the United States Golf
Association's image has been that of the all-knowing blue blazer-clad group that creates – with the R&A – the rules of the game, helps keep turfgrass green and alive, and sets up golf courses exceedingly hard.

Today? The USGA has the appearance of well-meaning bumblers using a set of conflicting rules designed to embarrass golfers, enforcing them on grass surfaces that lend themselves toward the ball moving rather than remaining stationary, and on golf courses that, at least for the U.S. Open, are close to unplayable.

Oh, and with their non-profit hand out during most every commercial break, asking for a donation "for the good of the game" before the action resumes on Fox, which is paying about \$100 million annually for the television rights.

And did we mention the group's inability to control the distance the ball goes? At least when the big guys hit it, that is.

The flaws in the organization – imperfections that can and should be corrected – have been on garish display of late. The worst was the rules flasco at the U.S. Open, where Dustin Johnson's penalty for the ball moving on the seventh green wasn't applied until after the round, and where he had to play the last six holes in the chase for the title not knowing exactly what his score was.

Along the way, we learned the rule calling the decision of the on-course referee final

is incorrect. The fine print says the referee can be overruled by other evidence, even when the referee, in this case Mark Newell, is the head of the USGA's rules committee.

So why is the rule in the book?

And we learned the USGA's decision in the wake of the penalty for a moving ball on Tiger Woods during the 2013 BMW Championship in Conway Farms, the decision that prohibits use of zoomed-in high-definition video to make a call, could also be ignored if the USGA decided to ignore it. (The circumstances of Woods, who didn't think the ball moved and didn't believe the video, and Johnson, who told Newell the ball moved but that he didn't make it move, are different, but the spy-eye video was used in each case.)

This sounds like the NHL, where things are often made up as the game goes along.

It would take three pages to print all the fine print from the Rules and Decisions books that can be used by one side or the other on the Johnson decision – and that's the problem.

As written, rewritten, amended and appended by the USGA and the R&A, they are simply too complicated, too riddled with loopholes, exceptions and those lawyerly favorites, "deemed" and "presumed."

Here's an idea: Get rid of the rule. Whether you hit it or not, if the ball moves and you didn't mean to hit it, put it back with no penalty. That's how it works if you tap the ball off the tee by accident in addressing it. Why not everywhere else?

After l'affaire Johnson, USGA boss Mike Davis pleaded for a mulligan – Mike, there's no such thing as winter rules – and promised the group would speed up its processes. Thus, at the U.S. Women's Open, after a Fox camera spotted Anna Nordqvist tipping a tiny, teeny clump of sand over on addressing the ball in a bunker on the second playoff hole, a quick decision was made: two-shot penalty.

Fine. But Nordqvist was told after her third shot on the final playoff hole, but Brittany Lang was told before her third shot, and immediately changed clubs.

Oops.

Given the timing, neither player should have been told until both third shots had been played.

Better yet, since it's a playoff, blow the horn and stop play once the replay appears. That leaves both players waiting on their second shot.

That's fair.

Isn't it time the USGA plays fair?

Leon McNair, 1941-2016 A man taken far too soon

t's difficult to write about Leon McNair without getting sentimental.

He was the kind of guy who, just by go-

He was the kind of guy who, just by going about his business and his life, more often than not brought out the best in others.

McNair, inducted into the Illinois Golf Hall of Fame last year, died Sunday, July 3, of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, a.k.a. Lou Gehrig's Disease. He was 75.

The longtime professional at Fox Bend Golf Course in Oswego, for which he was part of the construction crew, fought the disease for which there is as yet no cure valiantly.

A standout at Glenbard West High School and graduate of Southern Illinois, where he was a member of their 1964 NCAA Division II championship golf team, Leon was lured into staying at Fox Bend by architect and construction guru Brent Wadsworth. McNair was at Fox Bend from 1967 until his retirement in 2005.

McNair put Fox Bend on the map with an amateur tournament, the Fall Classic, to show the layout off to the better area players, as well as superior service to build a regular clientele.

Fox Bend hosted the Illinois Open three times, another McNair idea. Get the name of the course in the paper, and people will come out to play it. Simple, but effective. It worked. Fox Bend even

hosted a stage of PGA Tour qualifying once.

He remained active as a member of the board overseeing the First Tee of Aurora and Fox River Valley – which awards a Leon McNair Endowed Scholarship – and president of Wadsworth Golf Charities. He was Illinois PGA Section president in 1991-92, and the IPGA's Professional of the Year in 1992.

Most recently, he was spearheading Wad-

sworth's Links Across America initative to boost youth participation in the game.

"Leon was devoted to the mission," Wadsworth told the *Aurora Beacon-News*. "He felt a loyalty to the game and a desire to do as much as he could for young people. He was just a wonderful person through and through."

It was a longtime passion of McNair, who wanted to see kids on golf courses.

"The reason we launched Links Across America is, other than a few rare cases, affordable golf for youth does not exist in this country," McNair said in his Hall of Fame acceptance talk. "The mission was to develop feeder short courses, three-, six- or nine-hole across the country to provide affordable golf, especially for youth, families, adult beginners and individuals with injuries or disabilities."

By last fall, 29 courses had been built in 16 states.

McNair was also honored last fall by the state, which named the portion of Route 34 that runs in front of Fox Bend the Leon McNair Highway.

He is survived by wife Carole Anne, sons John and Jamie, three grandsons, brother Jim, and countless relatives and friends.

Crown has instant tradition

Second edition should build on surprises of the inaugural

t might not have been expected to develop so quickly, this desire by players to tee it up in the International Crown.

But ask anyone from Asia, which is excluded from the Solheim Cup, and you'll get an enthusiastic endorsement that the Crown, created by Sugar Grove tycoon Jerry Rich and brought to life by the LPGA in Maryland two years ago, it's the best thing this side of the Olympics – and maybe better.

"It's not just two countries (like the Solheim), it's eight," said Cristie Kerr, joined on the U.S. roster by Stacy Lewis, Lexi Thompson and Crown newcomer Jerina Piller. "It's all the media coverage from each country, all the visibility it gets, all the sponsors that it brings, and you can root for your country.

"The best eight are picked. I think that's why it's caught on so quickly."

Call it instant tradition. Rich may be sitting the second Crown out – it was scheduled for Rich Harvest Farms until a falling-out between him and the LPGA in a meeting with tour boss Mike Whan prompted Rich to withdraw his course nine months ago – but in one playing, the excitement that took the Solheim a decade or so to build up was in evidence at Caves Valley Golf Club.

Part of it might have been the format, as complicated as calculus to some.

"I don't think we quite understood the format and how it was all going to play out," Lewis said. "I think what I realized is that you can't really take a match off."

Lewis went 1-2 in her matches, and the U.S., blanked on Thursday, ended up losing to South Korea in the Saturday-night playoff for the fifth spot for the final-day singles matches. That left the Americans on the sideline in the chase for the Crown, which went to surprise winner Spain.

"You've got to out there and be aggressive on Thursday, and get as many points as you can get early, because we don't need to get into a playoff situation again," Lewis said.

Lewis wasn't alone in confusion over the format. The eight countries are split into two groups. Each team plays two best-ball matches daily, and plays the other three countries over three days.

The top two from each group advance, and the two third-place teams go into a playoff for the final spot. Somehow, it didn't play out that simply at Caves Valley.

This time, the second-seeded U.S. is grouped with Japan, Thailand and England. Top-seeded South Korea, Australia and the two Chinas – the People's Republic of China, and the Republic of China, going under the athletic pseudonym of Chinese Taipei, and with a different flag, because the Beijing-based China insists, or it would walk out – are in the other group.

"This is not just about golf," South Korea's So Yeon Ryu said. "This is totally festival. We

were a little disappointed to finish third. We were expecting to hold the beautiful crown, but we couldn't do it."

Ryu and Inbee Park, who is sidelined by a bum thumb, were in the playoff against Kerr and Thompson at Caves Valley. The two Koreans made pars, while Kerr parred and Thompson bogeyed, and that was it for the Yanks.

"Inbee and I both agreed, this is (a more) nervous moment than U.S. Women's Open championship putt," Ryu said. "That was how nervous we were. That was pretty amazing thing and pretty scary thing."

With no captains, the players decided among themselves who would play in sudden-death.

"We're all playing the first three days, then all of a sudden you have to pick two to be out there," Lewis said. "You don't want to be selfish and pick yourself. You want to do what's best for the team. You'd almost rather have an outside person make that decision for you."

Sixteen of the 32 players in the field are also in the Olympics, where the women's competition hasn't had nearly the number of withdrawals as the men's tournament. But of the two international showcases, only the Crown is a real team competition.

Aside from Lewis' noting that there's no captain to make a decision, the only real bugs in the Crown's qualification format is not having an automatic spot for the champion – Spain is missing in action this week – and the absence of the top two players in the women's world rankings.

No. 1 Lydia Ko, who won on Sunday in Ohio, and No. 2 Brooke Henderson, are from New Zealand and Canada respectively.

Ko is the only Kiwi on the LPGA Tour, and Henderson doesn't have highly-ranked country-women to complement her. If an at-large team was created, Ko, Henderson, No. 11 Anna Nordqvist of Sweden and No. 18 Suzann Petterson of Norway could play as well. Maybe a 10-team format, locking in the defenders (or a ninth qualifing team) and the at-larges is worth looking at down the line.

Merit Club looks better than it did for the 2000 U.S. Women's Open, and more receptive to scoring.

"There's reachable par 5s and drivable par 4s and a lot of tee options, so it's going to make for great golf," Lewis said. "Lexi's caddie wants to get a skins game going because he thinks there's going to be so many birdies out there."

And, perhaps, another surprise winner.

A Miller's tale

Illinois senior wins Kosin Cup on 5th try

our years ago, Stephanie Miller could taste victory in the Phil Kosin Illinois Women's Open. She was the leader after 36 holes. Once more around Mistwood Golf Club with a good score, and she would be the champion.

She fired an 80.

"For the first two days I played like I can," Miller said then. "And today I played like a high school player."

Which, in 2012, she was, weeks from starting her senior year at Stevenson High School in Lincolnshire.

On Wednesday, July 20, Miller was back at Mistwood, back with a share of the lead after duplicate rounds of 69, and weeks from starting her senior year at Illinois.

This time?

"I didn't play like a high schooler," Miller grinned after her third 69 in succession carried her to a total of 9-under-par 207 and a three-stroke victory over fellow amateur Kelly Grassel and the title in the 22nd playing of the state women's championship.

Miller played with poise and panache. She went a tournament-record 43 holes without a bogey, the streak ending with a bogey 4 on the 17th hole after the issue had been decided.

Miller pushed the issue on the front nine with three straight birdies on Nos. 5, 6 and 7, putting pressure on Brooke Ferrell, the Wisconsin senior who also started the final round of 6-under 138.

But Ferrell imploded in the middle of Kelpie's Corner, on the par-5 15th. She pulled her tee shot into the water and pushed her fourth out of bounds en route to a quadruple-bogey 9 that moved Miller's lead from one to five strokes and allowed her to coast in.

"I was confident after 13," Miller said, noting a key par save after she had pushed a shot well right. "Just keep your tempo."

The two time IHSA Class 2A champion did that better than anyone.

"It's a good boost of confidence, beating the girls I play with in college and will see after college," Miller said. "And it's good to know I can shoot three consecutive under-par scores. I hadn't done that before."

Ferrell, from Edgerton, Wis., ended up tied for third at 4-under 212 after her 2-over 74. For 17 holes of the final round, she was 2-under.

"It's a disappointing finish," said Ferrell, who shared second place last year. "You learn so much more from failure than from success. Two bad swings and I'm out of it."

That moved Grassel, of Chesterton, Ind., and

a Florida Gator, into second by virtue of a 3-under 69 for 6-under 210. She also had a long bogey-free streak, 38 holes, on a course where danger lurks early and often.

"I knew this was a very scorable course," Grassel said.

The low professional was Sterling's Ember Schuldt, an Illinois grad whose 2-under 214 total beat Wheaton's Jenna Pearson by four strokes and earned her \$5,000.

Miller's opening 69, which featured four

birdies on the back nine, was achieved by "staying patient," she said. "I just hit some good shots. The key here is putting the ball in good position. I missed three fairways, but when I missed a fairway, I missed in the right spot."

Perhaps the key to all this was not touching her clubs for more than a week. Miller came off a family vacation to Alaska on Saturday and only hit a few balls practicing on Sunday. Then it was go-time and Miller went about her business close to perfectly.

Her first round challengers included Ferrell and Fighting Illini teammate Dana Gattone, who will be a junior in the fall. She opened with a career-best 4-under 68 to share first with Ferrell.

Gattone, an Addison resident, speckled her career-best round with five birdies, with only one bogey staining it. The highlight was the final birdie, a 3-foot downhill putt on the par-3 17th, for it set her up to par the last and finally score less than 69.

"I feel really confident out here," Gattone said. "It sets up good for me, and for my course management."

But golf happens, and on Tuesday Gattone's 78 shoved her out of contention. Grassel and Crystal Lake's Lexi Harkins stood at 3-under 141, three strokes back of Miller and Ferrell, and figured to be the likely challengers in the final round. Harkins fell back to a tie for seventh with a 77 for 218, but Grassel's patient 69 earned her runner-up honors.

Chelsea Harris, mired in 21st place entering the final round, scored 4-under 68, the best round of the day, to climb into a tie for ninth.

Off the course, the highlight was the awarding of six \$1,000 scholarships to high school players through the Chicago Friends of Golf Foundation.

Cooking up something different

Return of Illinois Open to Royal Fox brings intrigue

avid Cooke's victory in last year's Illinois Open tugged at the heartstrings. He'd lost his brother Chad in a pickup basketball game at Christmastime the year before, and credited Chad's inspiration as vital to his triumph.

Cooke went on to make the Round of 32 in the U.S. Amateur at Olympia Fields.

Over the last 12 months, he excelled in his senior year at North Carolina State, including setting a course record 62 at Lonnie Poole Golf Course, an old Wolfpack haunt, and is ready to start his professional career.

At one point, Cooke's plan was to do so in the 67th Illinois Open, slated for July 25-27 at Royal Fox and Royal Hawk country clubs in St. Charles. Then he qualified for the U.S. Amateur, winning the qualifier at Illinois State's Weibring layout.

So Cooke will tee it up as an amateur at the Royals, giving the rest a better shot at the first prize, though no better shot at the title.

Cooke won that by five strokes last year, beating Illinois' best pros and amateurs handily at Royal Melbourne and Hawthorn Woods. His score of 16-under-par 199 set records for both raw total and in relation to par, while his 65-63 finish at Royal Melbourne set a record for the final 36 holes in an Illinois Open. It was the largest margin of victory since Mark Hensby won by

eight strokes in 1996.

Since then, Cooke's game has improved. That 62 helped him to a victory in the Wolfpack Spring Intercollegiate, and his 5-under-par 137 at Weibring advanced him to the U.S. Amateur for the second straight year.

The Illinois Open is making its eighth appearance at Royal Fox. It was played there from 1991-95 and 2000-01 and produced a collection of winners including Marty Schiene, Dino Lucchesi, Gary Groh, Rick Dalpos, then-amateur Curtis Malm and Roy Biancalana.

Schiene's 1992 victory, the second of his three, was the most dramatic. He and Groh tied after 54 holes, were still tied after a three-hole playoff, and went three more sudden-death holes before Schiene won with a birdie.

Amateurs have won their share and contended often in the last decade. Cooke was the third amateur to win in nine years, joining Joe Emerich and Brad Benjamin, and three other ams, most recently Dustin Korte in 2013, have been second, either solo or sharing, since 2007.

As was the case last year, the first two rounds are being played on two courses. Each of the 258 players in the expanded field plays one course on Monday and the other on Tuesday.

Those making the cut go for the prize, and the pros for the money, at Royal Fox on Wednesday. Last year's purse was \$75,000, and this year's is expected to be in the vicinity.

Knocks off Mitchell in rare battle of mid-amateurs

hrowback Thursday, the Chicago District Golf Association could have nicknamed the championship match in the 97th CDGA Amateur Championship.

Two mid-amateurs, drawn from the 25-andup gang that often gets pummeled by the college crowd in amateur play, surviving to meet in the title tilt?


Yep. Sure as Byron Nelson's victory in the 1945 Chicago Victory Open – another CDGA production – is still revered at Calumet Country Club, Thursday, June 30 found Andrew Price and Todd Mitchell, who share both an affility for golf and careers in the insurance business, on the first tee for their 36-hole argument across Calumet's leafy acreage.

Each came in with impressive golf resumes. Mitchell owns two Illinois Amateur titles, while Price won the Illinois Mid-Amateur two years ago. But neither had snagged the CDGA Am, the group's oldest bauble, dating all the way back to the 1914 founding of the organization.

Price would emerge victorious, the 34-yearold from Lake Bluff scoring a 4 and 3 victory over Mitchell, who hails from downstate BloomTim Cronin / Illinois Goffer **EAGLE-EYED** Andrew

ington, in a 36-hole match in which Price was the steadier of the two, and also made more putts.

"I hit some good shots, made a couple putts, some good up-and-downs," Price said. "It was solid today."

It wasn't Price's first match against Mitchell. He knew the match for the Joe Davis Perpetual Trophy would be a real test.

"You've just got to be steady," Price said. "You know he's going to play well. Try to be as consistent as you can and give yourself some birdie looks. Capitalize on them when you have them.

"I never really thought I had it under control."

He did, because there was one flaw in the usually steady Mitchell's game. His putter betrayed him.

"I just fought my putter all week long, especially from mid-range, four to 10 feet," Mitchell said. "If I would have made some putts, we probably would have been walking down our 36th hole. I'll bet for the week I was under 50 percent (from four to 10 feet). You can't expect to win if that's what you bring to the table.

"Andrew played extremely well, forced me to make some putts, and I just wasn't able to do it."

For Mitchell to even get to the final match when he was having trouble from four to 10 feet – the critical scoring range for everyone – is a tribute to the rest of his game. After qualifying with a 36-hole total of 3-over-par 143, the feature an afternoon 2-under-par 68, he knocked off three straaight higher-seeded opponents: Charlie Netzel, 5 and 4; Paul Schlimm Jr., 4 and 3; and Kyle Slattery, 2 and 1 in the semifinal.

In comparison, Price tied for third in the qualifier, then beat three straight players who were

After Mitchell's birdie on the first hole to grab a short-lived lead, form held. Price was too much for him, making five birdies in the morning round to build a 3-up lead.

The match leaned even more in Price's favor on the 27th hole, Calumet's par-5 ninth. Mitchell was looking at a 4-foot birdie putt, but Price drilled a 200-yard approach to 12 feet and sank the putt for an eagle, a 4-up lead, and effectively, the match. With Mitchell struggling on the greens, Price could cruise from there.

It ended on the par-4 15th when Mitchell saw a 5-foot par putt skid by the hole.

"We know what we're going to get with each

other," Mitchell said. "The guy who makes the least amount of mistakes is going to win, and to-day I made more mistakes than he did. He played very solid, made three bogeys in 33 holes."

Price was on edge, and thus on his game, until the end.

"With a guy like him, you can never rest with a couple hole lead, because he can make birdies at any time."

Price and Mitchell had company among their peers. Fully nine of the 16 match play qualifiers were mid-amateurs, five advanced to the final eight, and three mid-ams were in the semis, the exception Kyle Slattery of Rockford, who plays for Southern Illinois-Edwardsville.

Price was not surprised.

"There were a bunch of great players here, wherher college kids of mid-ams."

Having won of the two amateurs-only state majors, Price would seem to be a lock to be among the favorites for the Illinois Amateur, slated for St. Charles Country Club only July 19-21.

Wrong.

While he works in the family insurance business, and, as he said, "My dad gives me time off when I need it," the Illinois Am coincides with a charity fund-raiser in which the entire family picthes in.

Mitchell will be there, looking for a third title. Expect him to have ironed out his putting woes.

Prassas rambles to victory over teammate

onnor Prassas had to work overtime to collect his biggest championship in junior golf.

That was fine by him.

The extra effort meant the Winnetka teen, a senior at Loyola Academy this fall, captured the 47th Illinois Junior Amateur on the third hole of sudden death at Makray Memorial Golf Course in Barrington via a par 5 to fellow Winnetkan and Rambler Chip Savarie's bogey.

"I wanted to win so badly," Prassas said of beating his pal and teammate. "If I lost to him it would be like losing to my younger brother and I knew I would hear about it for a while."

They had tied at 5-over-par 218, Prassas closing with a 5-over 76 to Savarie's 1-under 70, and then parred the treacherous 18th the first time – Prassas lipping out a birdie putt – and traded birdies the second time to set up a third go at Makray's last.

"I wasn't very nervous, just trying to stay focused on every shot," Prassas said.

Savarie's 70 had been the low final round on the 6,587-yard layout. He'd birdied the 18th and had the clubhouse lead before Prassas, the leader after 36 holes, matched the bird with a 4 of his own, a downhill 10-footer, to trigger extra holes.

On the fourth time through, and the third in the playoff, Prassas played the dogleg right, with

water lurking on the inner corner of the hole, carefully. Savarie gambled and lost. He went for the green with his second shot and it crashed into the bushes between the ninth and 18th greens. He could do no better than bogey, and placed second to his year-older teammate.

For Prassas, the third time was the charm.

He'd qualified for Illinois' junior golf championship the last two years, but didn't survive the 36-hole trim. This year, after tying for first in his qualifier at Broken Arrow Golf Course in Lockport, he blazed through the first 36 holes.

Then he found out what most every elite player does. It's not easy to go to bed the leader.

"Knowing the golf course better, especially the greens really helped me this year," Prassas said. "I felt really good coming into the final round as the leader but it was harder to sleep on it.

"I didn't play that great in the final round but I hung in there and made a few birdies on the back nine, but the playoff was awesome. This isn't the first time I have a playoff with Chip, we played-off against each other last year for the state championship so it made me less nervous and made it more fun.

"It means a lot to me. This is the tournament I used to grind to qualify for, and I looked up at the players who won.

"It feels great to be that player."

From their 1-2 finish, it's obvious the Ramblers will be loaded come the high school season in the fall. The Ramblers didn't qualify in Class 3A as a team last fall, but Prassas finished in a tie for 31st in his junior year.

Prassas hasn't decided on a college yet, but allowed that his success "has created many exciting opportunities."

Tying for third with a three-day total of 7-

Comes from mid-pack to run through field in match play

here's a nationwide trend to eliminate trees on golf courses. Oakmont Country Club, once an arboretum, is a sterling example of how clearing a path can reveal a golf course.

Jillian Hollis wouldn't have minded the removal of at least one tree at Dayton (Ohio) Country Club on June 25. It was directly in her path, 115 yards from the green on the final hole of her 36-hole match with Mikhaela Fortuna for the 116th Women's Western Amateur Championship.

She turned to her caddie and asked, "Is this tree going to be a problem?"

Her caddie, who happens to be her mother, Sharon, a former college golfer, said, "I can hit the ball over that tree."

Hollis was 1-up on Fortuno. Soon, after a perfect 50-degree wedge that stopped 10 feet beneath the cup, and a smooth birdie putt, Hollis was a 2-up winner of the nation's second-oldest women's amateur championship.

A sophomore at Georgia in the fall, Hollis lives in Rocky River, Ohio, near Cleveland, but was little more familiar with Dayton's course than Fortuno, a 15-year-old from far-off Dasmarinas, Philippines.

By the end of the week, she knew every inch

She certainly knew the 18th hole, where she won two earlier matches and extended one, against Kelly Whaley, whom she needed two extra holes to knock off in the semifinal.

"It's funny how golf is," Hollis said to www. georgiadogs.com, the school's sports website. "Sometimes you think you're really ready to play well, like I was at NCAAs, and then you don't. This week, I wasn't so sure how I'd play, and I ended up playing nine rounds and winning."

Fortina was 1-up after the morning round of the double-round final thanks to a birdie on the 18th hole, and was 3-up after a birdie binge on the front nine after lunch.

Then Hollis took over. She birdied the 10th, 11th, 13th – with a 28-foot putt – and 14th holes to square the match, Fortuna having won the 12th. Hollis then won the 16th with a chip to within 30 inches of the cup to go 1 up. Both players parred the 17th, and Hollis finished the match with the birdie after clearing the tree for the 2-up margin.

The turnaround came about, Hollis told the *Dayton Daily News*, because she and her mom switched earrings.

"She said they used to do that at North Carolina State. It was like rally caps."

Hollis had made the 64-player match play field in the middle of the pack, but marched relentlessly to the semis. There, she ran into Whaley, who took her into sudden-death before she prevailed on the second extra hole.

Fortuna, whose poise belies her age, was

also extended, and to the 22nd hole, by Lydia Gumm of Radcliff, Ky., a Florida State standout, in the quarterfinals. Fortuna had a 3-up lead over Gumm, 120th in the world ranking and last year's runner-up, after 13 holes, but Gumm won the next four holes to lead 1 up going to the last.

Fortuna squared the match and sent it to the 19th tee with a big drive and 90-yard pitch to five feet for a birdie. The duo matched pars on the first three extra holes before Fortuna parred the fourth hole and Gumm bogeyed.

After a quick lunch, Fortuna squared off with Sophia Schubert of Oak Ridge, Tenn., dismissing her via a 3 and 2 margin.

"I'm thrilled to getting a crack at the championship," Fortuna said after beating Schubert. "It's been a good week for me. My ball-striking is quite okay and my irons and putting are working. I just hope to sustain my form and continue to get the breaks."

The last break went to Hollis.

"That was the hardest match I've ever played," Hollis said. "I haven't played anyone with that good of a short game in a while."

Short game excellence was the byword of the tournament. There were six holes-in-one, including two by Lexie Toth of Dublin, Ohio. Toth was knocked out of the running early in match play.

Kate Lillie captures 90th WWGA Junior

emember this name: Kate Lillie.

Lillie beat Barrington's Nicole Ciskowski 3 and 1 in the semifinals, while Tir knocked off Loren Skibba of Verona, Wis., 5 and 4.

AROUND ILLINOIS Habjan recalled as master craftsman

el many miles from his birthplace in North Chicago to find his life's work. He was the head pro at Onwentsia Club in Lake Forest for 42 years beginning in 1956. There, at the club where he caddied when he was 9 years old, he gained just renown as a clubmaker, player, teacher and mentor.

Habjan, 84, died July 5 in The Villages, Fla., after a full life that included a great deal of behind-the-scenes work with the Illinois PGA and the PGA of America.

But he was known for, and inducted into the Illinois Golf Hall of Fame in the inaugural class in 1989 for his work at Onwentsia, where he arrived as an assistant to George Smith after one year at Indian Hill Club following a stint in the Army.

It was a prudent move, for Hubby – nobody except his parents called him Rudolph – found himself popular with club members, and the obvious choice to succeed Smith when the veteran retured.

That was in 1956. Habjan took over the shop and ran it until he retired in 1997.

"He was an innovator, a pro's pro, dedicated to our members and to the profession," Onwentsia Club head pro Nick Papadakes told the *Daily Herald*.

Habjan summed it up this way in 1976: "Teach the game of golf, its rules and ethics and offer the finest golf clubs for my pupils."

Immediately, he made an impact in all those categories, with the latter providing the longest impact. Club making, today a lost art among most profes-

sionals, was his passion. He designed woods and built them himself in the workroom behind the Onwentsia shop, but for members who valued quality, and for like-minded players around the world, many of them touring pros. Among those using Habjan clubs in their heyday were Arnold Palmer and Lee Trevino.

"Now it's done all the time for professional golfers, but he was at the forefront of that," said nephew Don Habjan, the professional at Makray Memorial Golf Club. "He was so far ahead of his time."

Time and again, Habjan clubs – woods and irons – were coveted. A check on eBay, as the photo to the right indicates, indicates they still are. (The set of irons, Nos. 4 through 10, from which that photo is drawn, was offered for \$120.) Along the way, Habjan consulted for Faultless,



Tommy Armour Golf and Brunswick's golf division.

Habjan was 34 when he was named the PGA of America's Professional of the Year in 1965, the youngest so honored.

By then, he was already deeply involved with Illinois PGA business, beginning with a stint as

secretary-treasurer from 1963 to 1966. He was also on the national PGA's rules committee from 1968 to 1978, and ran the PGA's Caribbean Tour each winter from 1966 to 1970.

In 1973, he was elected the Illinois PGA's president, while from 1974 to 1976, he was a vice president of the PGA of America. Habjan still had time for all his duties at Onwentsia while dealing with his cohorts.

The Illinois PGA honored him with its Teacher of the Year award in 1989.

Habjan was not only a gifted teacher and club maker, but he was a talented player as well, his resume including two appearances in the PGA Championship as well as the British Open. In 1968, one of his most remarkable accomplishments took place. He was the only pro to birdie the same par-3 at the Carnoustie Golf Links in all four rounds during the British Open.

After retiring, he kept playing, and frequently won local senior tournaments in Florida, taking great pride in the fact that he would regularly score lower than his age.

In his own words, his lifetime ambition was to "teach the game of golf, its rules and ethics, make it enjoyable, keep it a walking game, and make the finest golf clubs for my pupils."

He was inducted into the PGA of America Hall of Fame in 2005, one of only 157 to earn this distinction in the organization's history.

Away from golf, Habjan was a devoted student of the American West. In 1985 he found his second home at Eatons' Ranch in Wolf, Wyo. He visited several times a year and shared his fondness for Eatons' with both his children and grandchildren. He was a familiar sight at the rail beside the barn, watching the horses come down in the early morning hours with a cup of coffee in hand.

His favorite horse was Rio, and as recently as last August he could be found guiding his family along the trails of his beloved South Red Canyon.

Habjan is survived by wife Marilynn "Lynn" Habjan, sons Tim and Bruce, daughter Cindy, eight grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

A memorial service will be held at Saturday, July 23, from 4 to 7 p.m., at the Onwentsia Club, 300 N. Green Bay Rd., Lake Forest. Flores wins Lincoln Land

Martin Flores had been striving for a pro victory for a long time, and it came for the 34year-old Dallas resident on Sunday, July 17, at Panther Creek Country Club. Flores' final round 4-under-par 67 earned him a two-stroke victory over a quartet of players that included two-time PGA Tour winner Wesley Bryan and Casey Wittenberg.

Flores' total of 22-under-par 262 wasn't without incident. He was 13-of-15 across four rounds in par-saves, including 8-of-8 in the final round.

"You always want to win, no matter where you are," Flores said. "That's why we practice so hard. Winning is not something that comes along all the time for golfers."

Barring a complete surprise, the victory will return Flores to the PGA Tour at the end of the Web.com Tour season. He jumped to No. 4 on that circuit's money list with \$99,000 from the \$550,000 purse.

Deerfield's Vince India (272) tied for 33rd, while Illinois-connected Brian Campbell and Charlie Danielson (140) and Mike Small (147) missed the cut. Scoring on page 21.
